- IV. Project Proposal Heidi Burke (voting)

Five Talents Book Fund

SUMMARY: Senate will allocate \$1000 to the History and Political Studies Department for a book fund for students

PROBLEM:

• History classes regularly require students to purchase multiple textbooks for each class.

- Textbooks are expensive.
- Students who cannot afford material for class are unable to keep up with assignments especially because they are required to bring books to class.

SOLUTION:

- 1. For their departmental proposal, the Department of History and Political Studies requests \$1000 for a "Five Talents Book Fund"
- 2. Funds will be disbursed to students on a first-come, first-served basis for purchasing HPS textbooks

IMPLEMENTATION:

Throughout the Fall 2025 semester, HPS will establish eligibility criteria for the Five Talents Book Fund and publicly announce the initiative to students. Students may start applying for funding in the Winter 2026 semester.

DISCUSSION 5 minutes

1. Can you reclarify what the plan for redistribution is?

a. Working with the professor for classes what are most commonly taken. They will be mostly lower division classes. We announce it before the semester begins, describing that the first ones who get there. It would be a loan system, where they promise to give it back .We may also donate it to the library, creating a system to use them as much as possible for students.

2. How many books would that cover?

a. About \$20-50 is . I want to say \$70 for all the three history book. The goal isn't to give the history department books, but instead to show that students are interested and are actively asking for it. We want to show initiative

3. The professor that you spoke with, were they expressing a big need in the past?

a. They were asking to bring the textbooks in, and not an electronic version. They say it is a barrier for students who cna't quite bring those books to class.

4. Is there a way that there us this as a --- program, can this fund be used as a \$35 instead.

a. I love that, I would recommend that. We are colabrating with the history department but we can't really dictate how they are to allocate those funds. I am more than happy to make a list of suggestions, but they will see where it is most needed.

5. Do you know if the books usually change editions.

a. Personally, it has been the same for all the three years, I think it remains the same for all three years.

V. Project Proposal – Naomi Munyaka

Installing UVC port charging stations in the library

SUMMARY: Installing UVC 8-port charging stations would provide convenient access to power in high-use study spaces in the Beitz Center and Mckee Library, supporting academic work and reducing interruptions. These stations will be beneficial for a wide range of students.

BENEFITS: Secure charging & sanitizing: The UVC-8 station provides 8 lockable lockers that both charge devices and sanitize them with UV-C light, reducing germs buy up to 99%.

Student convenience & safety: Students can safely leave devices to charge without worrying about theft, while also reducing shared surface contact and promoting campus hygiene.

Campus value: Installing these stations enhances campus wellness, supports students during long days or events, and reflects a commitment to modern, tech-friendly amenities.

- a. Cost \$3.375.00 for BOTH stations
- b. Point of Contact Deyse Bravo (Director of Libraries McKee Library) and Jowy Tolbert (Facilities Manager in Bietz Center for Student Life)

MOTION: I move to approve the installation of one charging station in the Mckee Library and Beitz Center

DISCUSSION

- 1. Did you confirm with the update price and shipping?
 - a. Yes, this would be for two charging stations.
- 2. Were we able to suggest to the Director and Facilitor Manager to split the cost?
 - a. Because this is an issue that we shared in the past, they are expecting this from the senate. That is why I had navigated this with that assumption
- 3. Why are we getting a station, and not chargers that we could lend out?
 - a. This is a need that they expressed, this could also be more a organizational issue.
- 4. Did we discuss branding?
 - a. I know then one in the Libary does have the mascot and some designs on it, We were speaking and they mentioned that they had that installed, but I could not find any record for the source we bought this from, or who installed it.
- 5. I wanted to remind everyone that we shared last week that we are not going to vote on this next week. I want to share some sentiments of library workers that I collected who would disapprove of this proposal.

- a. Leah Christ and Jessica Spears shared some concerns with this proposals. The floors are independent of each other and the ones seeking a charging station is the 3rd floor. The first floor is wanting to move it from the main floor. The noise can be frustrating, and they aren't used as much. They have looked into moving their charger to their 3rd floor in that case that is all needed.
- b. If we are not voting this this week, I would suggest to split it into two proposal and consider it separately.
- c. Response to suggestion: Message recieved in kind of a shock since she spoke to the head of McKee library, the one in charge. It was assumed that she has already coveed the opinion of her workers preiviously since their input is just as important.

- 6. Would it be possible to buy only one for Bietz center? Is there a benefit to buy in bulk?
 - a. The only thing you have to consider is that you pay shipping twice.
- 7. If we are going to be more efficiently? Maybe like a system of lending ID cards.
 - a. That would be more liability on the people that are holding them. This is just an easy way to cut through that where you can be confident that the phone will be where you placed it.
- 8. Taking about the chargers, we can rent chargers from the front desk.
 - a. And it is definitely has to do with people not returning the chargers.

2. Can you expand for MEAN allocation, and how this contributes to the overall setting the allocations

a. We used that as a starting number and then we considered how active they are on campus. From there we calculate how much money is left, and finally we distribute it by amount of members. If we average \$300, then we say that, and majority we only add to that. The only reason we would "deduct" would be if there were already departmentally funded (decrease by 30%) or if they directly expressed that they didn't need as much funds.

3. Can you state how many statistically we can find for the \$10,000?

a. We are already holding 10,000 to allocate, but we are holding the rest for next semester.

SOLUTION : Purchasing the Samsung QH55C 55" 4K UHD Commercial Monitor. This the standard for the University, already being ordered by Sewell

COST:

TV - \$1,055 | Shipping - \$0 | Installation - \$0

DISCUSSION

- 1. Who is going to install the TV?
 - i. Campus Safety
