Creating an Online Communication Option

SUMMARY: As part of the You Matter campaign, Senate will add an online, anonymous option for student feedback to the Senate website.

VII. Project Proposal – Naomi Munyaka

Installing UVC port charging stations in the library

SUMMARY: Installing UVC 8-port charging stations would provide convenient access to power in high-use study spaces in the Beitz Center and Mckee Library, supporting academic work and reducing interruptions. These stations will be beneficial for a wide range of students.

BENEFITS:

- Secure charging & sanitizing: The UVC-8 station provides 8 lockable lockers that both charge devices and sanitize them with UV-C light, reducing germs buy up to 99%.
- Student convenience & safety: Students can safely leave devices to charge without worrying about theft, while also reducing shared surface contact and promoting campus hygiene.

- Campus value: Installing these stations enhances campus wellness, supports students during long days or events, and reflects a commitment to modern, tech-friendly amenities.
 - a. Cost \$3,503.00
 - b. Point of Contact Deyse Bravo (Director of Libraries McKee Library) and Jowy

Tolbert (Facilities Manager in Bietz Center for Student Life)

MOTION: I move to approve the installation of one charging station in the Mckee Library and Beitz Center

DISCUSSION

- 1. What is the shipping cost?
 - a. I haven't added it, as far as I remember it may be part of the cost mentioned above
 - b. Senator comment: We don't pay tax so we would subtract 403
- 2. Can you clarify if you are installing 1 or 2?
 - a. One for each building. In Bietz and McKee
- 3. Is this something that is needed?
 - a. This is something that they voiced
 - b. The reason is that they needed one more and because the students would leave devices unattended
- 4. As someone who works at Beitz, I see the need and there are some that aren't working
- 5. What percentage of the budget will this take up?
 - a. Our budget is \$15,000, this is about 21% of our budget
- 6. Did one building express a higher need?
 - a. Initially this was a proposal by McKee Library, but after doing some research, Bietz asked to take part of this.
- 7. How much will each device charge and will the station distribute that energy from the power source?
 - a. Phone was dead, charged for 10 minutes and it was 34%,
 - b. You also have three options for USB-C or iPhone. It doesn't function any differently except that it is enclosed in a cage.
- 8. Since this is a sizeable portion of the budget, is it possible to discuss to collaborate with McKee and Bietz and split the cost?
 - a. In previous years, Senate was responsible for providing this for students. In 2021 they funded these portable chargers.
- 9. On an actual website, we noticed there are no functional problem with its methods according to the watts capacity

- 10. I noticed that there are possibilities for changing the aesthetic, would there be a price added if we do it?
 - a. This one is just the locker. To have it customized has an addition of 2,000 more. I don't see it worth the price
- 11. Comment: With shipping it would be \$3,375
- 12. Would it be better to have a better specific input for the library staff through a survey?
 - a. Getting feedback for a friend that shared that this installation might complicate things. Some would disagree

VIII. Project Proposal – Heidi Burke

Five Talents Book Fund

SUMMARY: Senate will allocate \$1000 to the History and Political Studies Department for a book fund for students

PROBLEM:

- History classes regularly require students to purchase multiple textbooks for each class.
- Textbooks are expensive.
- Students who cannot afford material for class are unable to keep up with assignments especially because they are required to bring books to class.

SOLUTION:

- 1. For their departmental proposal, the Department of History and Political Studies requests \$1000 for a "Five Talents Book Fund"
- 2. Funds will be disbursed to students on a first-come, first-served basis for purchasing HPS textbooks

IMPLEMENTATION:

Throughout the Fall 2025 semester, HPS will establish eligibility criteria for the Five Talents Book Fund and publicly announce the initiative to students. Students may start applying for funding in the Winter 2026 semester.

DISCUSSION

- 1. What happens at the end of the semester? Do you sell them back or keep them?
 - a. The history club will work to loan them to you, and therefore reuse them for multiple years
- 2. Is there a way to write a contract so that the students can return this without any marks or annotations? That way we secure that it may be reused for the future generations
- 3. Can we assure how many students \$1,000 help?
 - a. Because textbooks are so costly, it doesn't go extremely far, but it starts somewhere. With this, we could definitely cover at least one class, and that is more than what's being done.
- 4. Can you expand on the scholarship?
 - a. It will be on a first come first serve basis. There is more likely that the history majors will see it, but if we push this forward through media.
- 5. Would these books be departmentally exclusive?
 - a. Yes, most of these books would be staying in the department.
- 6. Could there be a way to see that these history books would be going to the lower division classes so that it could impact more students?
 - a. Yes I would be willing to ask and talk more about this.
